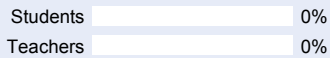

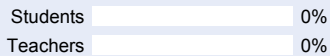

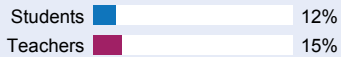

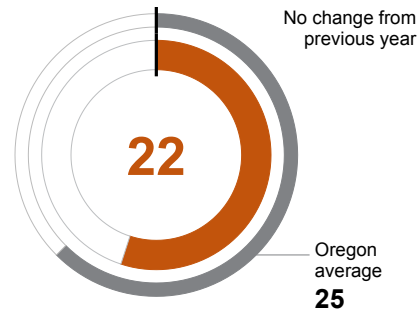

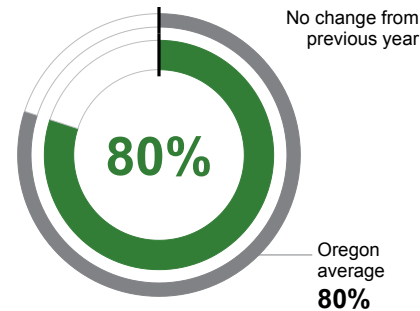
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

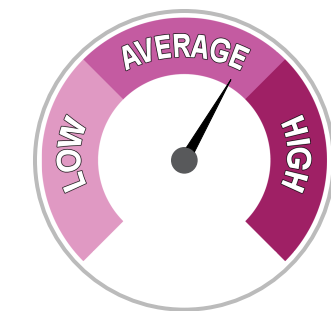
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

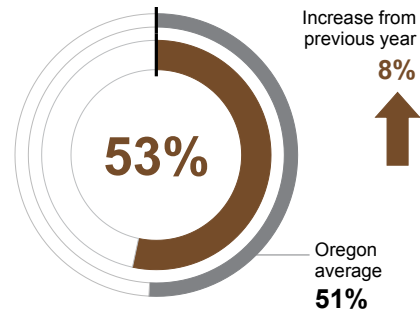
Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

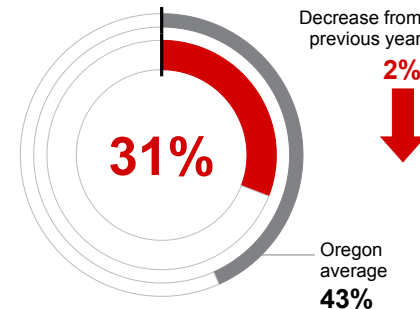
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

School Goals

Our school is committed to providing well-rounded learning experiences for each child and to making each child feel safe and connected to a caring adult while at school. Improving student achievement in English Language Arts and Math is a primary goal. The addition of a full-time PE program will result in higher student engagement, and lower chronic absenteeism. Utilizing transformational social-emotional learning strategies through our Star Power X program, we aim to create healthy learning environments that foster a climate of safety, caring and respect that result in improved student academic outcomes.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

Sunnyslope is a warm and welcoming place. We are a community of learners including teachers, parents, students and staff. Our small population of approximately 287 students allows for more personal connections between students, teachers and families of Sunnyslope. Our parent community enthusiastically supports us. Parents volunteer in classrooms, in the library, computer lab, and at special events. Our Booster Club and staff work together to support the education of every student.

BULLYING, HARASSMENT, AND SAFETY POLICIES

Sunnyslope has a Dynamic Behavior Support Team of professionals that work together to support students in the classroom and other areas of the building. This team includes a Child Development Specialist who visits every classroom every six days. She teaches lessons on socio-emotional needs, how to address bullying and harassment, conducting oneself with integrity and honesty, among many other topics. Skill groups for students who are struggling (e.g., connecting with others appropriately, strategies for behaving appropriately on the bus, etc.), are used. We employ a number of strategies for connecting adults and students for positive reinforcement.
